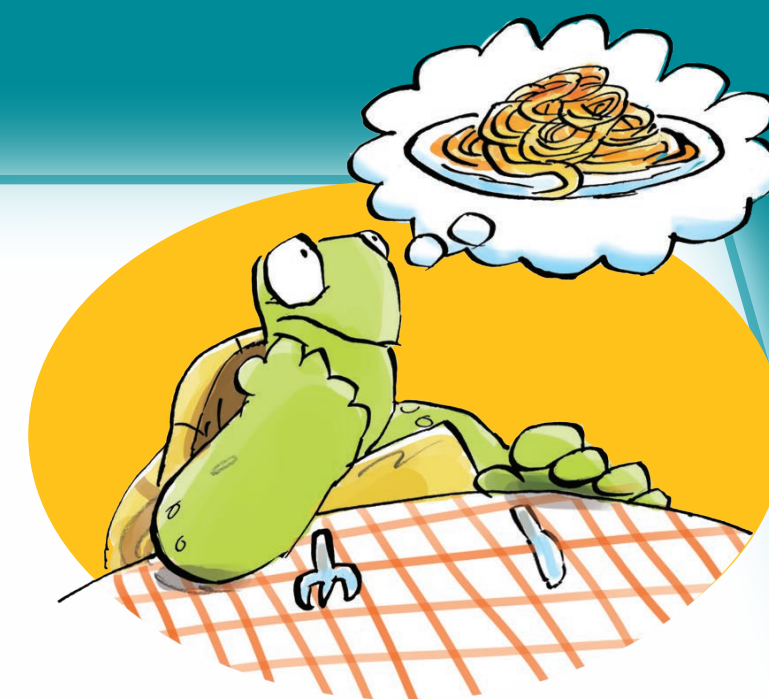


Simple past, regular verbs

jump – jump**ed** shout – shout**ed**land – land**ed** look at – look**ed** at

I was so hungry. Great, spaghetti – yummy! Suddenly the dog jump**ed** onto the table. 'Go away, silly dog!' I shout**ed**. The plate land**ed** on the floor. Now the dog was next to the spaghetti. He look**ed** at the spaghetti.



Simple past, irregular verbs

wake up – **woke up** feel – **felt** have – **had**go – **went** give – **gave** say – **said**

Last Friday, Lily, the lolly monster **woke up** at half past eight. She **felt** awful. She **had** a terrible stomach-ache. She **went** to the hospital. The doctor **gave** her a pink, a red and a blue pill. Lily **said**, 'Can I have a lolly? I really don't like pills!' 'I'm sorry,' the doctor **said**, 'No lolly for you!'



Negatives with simple past

I went to the beach, but I **didn't go** swimming.
He played basketball, but he **didn't play** football.
She saw a lion, but she **didn't see** a monkey.



Questions and answers with simple past

Did you **go** shopping?Yes, I **did**.Did you **see** the Statue of Liberty?No, I **didn't**.When **did** you **get** home?

Yesterday.

Future with *going to* + infinitiveI'm **going to sit** in the garden.It's **going to be** rainy.I'm **not going to cook** pizza.It's **not going to be** sunny.Questions and answers with *going to* + infinitiveAre you **going to play** lots of football?

Yes, I am.

Are you **going to watch** TV?

No, I'm not.
