Jack **plays** the guitar.

They really **like** our music.

He's **reading** a book.

They're **watching** us record our new song.



### Going to; ordinal numbers 11–31

This year the **21<sup>st</sup> (twenty-first)** of May is going to be a Monday.

The **22<sup>nd</sup> (twenty-second)** of May is going to be a Tuesday.

The **23<sup>rd</sup> (twenty-third)** of May is going to be a Wednesday.

The **24<sup>th</sup> (twenty-fourth)** of May is going to be a Thursday.

The **25<sup>th</sup> (twenty-fifth)** of May is going to be a Friday.



### Connectors; went + ing

I looked into the water, **but** I didn't see the fish.

We went to a lake **and** we had a picnic there.

I **went swimming because** the water was warm.



### Could / Couldn't

When I was young 40 years ago I **could jump** higher than a tree.

**Could** you **swim** for 10 hours?

I **couldn't run** 20 kilometres.

The **heaviest** dinosaur was **heavier than** 17 African elephants.

The film *Planet of Dinosaurs* is good, but there is a **better** film: *Jurassic Park*. *Jurassic Park* is **the best** dinosaur film.

The special effects are **worse** in old dinosaur films.
