

### Speaking practice

Smart Planet 3 corresponds to A2–A2+ of the CEFR. There are two speaking-practice activity sheets for each unit.

#### Procedure

Students read the situation or problem individually and look at the pictures. Give students time to make notes about vocabulary they might need or ideas they have. Students work in pairs. They discuss the problem or situation and try to agree on a solution or the best idea.

#### Evaluation

Assessment should focus on three areas: grammar and vocabulary, pronunciation and interactive communication (see table below).

<b>1</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Shows only limited control of a few grammatical forms.</li> <li>Uses a vocabulary of isolated words and phrases.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Has very limited control of phonological features and is often unintelligible.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Has considerable difficulty maintaining simple exchanges.</li> <li>Requires additional prompting and support.</li> </ul>
<b>0</b>	<i>Performance below Band 1.</i>
